



## PRO TIP - Ross Sutherland

#### Delicate Chip – Don't quit the shot for solid contact.

Play this shot with a 9-iron or pitching wedge, a grip of about the same firmness you'd use to restrain a pet canary, and a chipping-type stroke. Set your weight on your leading foot, the ball in the centre of your stance, and your hands in line with the golf ball, shaft leaning slightly forward at address. Hold the clubface square through-out the short back-and throughswing. Because of the softness of the shot, the tendency is to scoop at the ball or quit on the stroke, so good prime thought is to swing down and through the ball.
