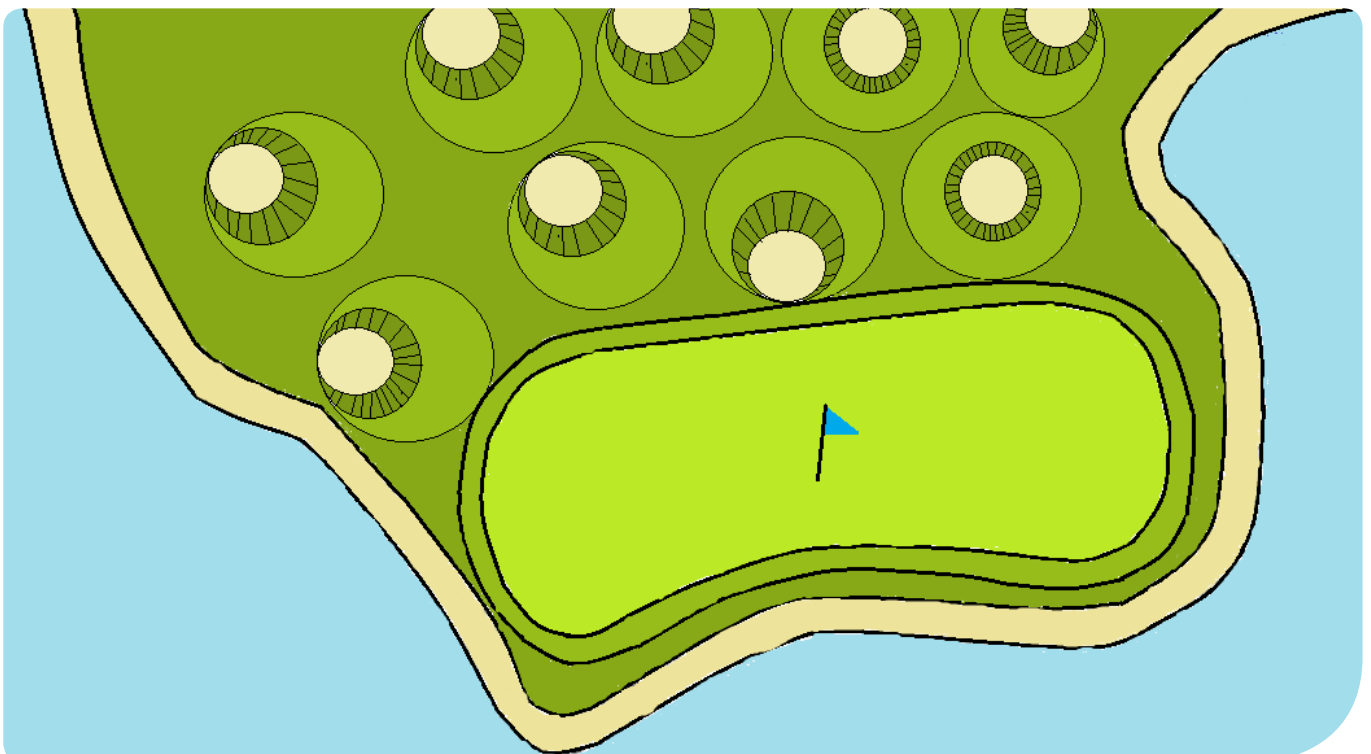

PRO TIP by Ross Sutherland

SHOULDER TILT

Keep the left side low at the top of the backswing for accuracy.

On full shots, your shoulder turn can become too level at the top of the backswing and a blocked shot to the right often results. You can really see this when hitting your driver. Completing your backswing with the proper shoulder tilt – left shoulder lower than your right – helps swing the club down on plane and square the clubface at impact.
