## Introduction from the Captain - Mr. Graeme Thomson

Dear Members,

Following a few days respite to recover from all the festive ongauns, our club activities were kick-started for 2014 with the Social on Sunday 12th January and the Algarve Invitational Seniors Tournament 16th-19th January.

Now in its second year this senior's tournament is going from strength to strength, increasing in popularity with European Tour professionals... along with aspiring professionals seeking their Tour Card from the annual Seniors Tour School later in the month.

This initiative in association with Pinheiros Altos was developed - and has been heavily sponsored by - PA member John Waters, who I understand has already committed to maintaining his sponsorship for January 2015.

Due to a number of factors (not least available light), participant numbers are limited to 72, and this year's field saw 54 professionals - including the top 4 European Seniors, several well-known names and past Ryder Cup team members. It is truly a showcase for the quality of senior golf, and for the growing reputation of Pinheiros Altos within the Professional Golf fraternity.

This year's winner Miguel Angel Martin, who was assisted by a first round course record 63 achieved in difficult conditions, finished on -10, and with a total 206 to take the trophy and 1st prize of 5000 Euros.

In his acceptance speech Miguel was roundly supported by his fellow professionals for his generous acknowledgement of the tournament organization led by Christophe Rindlisbacher, the general condition of the golf course (which had withstood significant rainfall during the competition) and all PA staff for their efforts to prepare the course each morning.

Plans are already in discussion for next year and we hope to build with the positive momentum and develop the Pro-Am aspect alongside the main event.

For my part... I'm seriously indebted to the Lady Captain for her considerable generosity in caddying for me. My playing partners were all very jealous and my clubs have never been cleaner! Wind, rain, early mornings and the lack of 10% of any winnings... what a star! Thank you Rie.

As we are gradually approaching our annual AGM on Thursday 17th April, I wish to take this opportunity to inform you that your committee over the last few months has been considering a refreshment of the Membership rules.

Our existing rules have been evolved over many years and it is now felt appropriate to review, and where necessary, update them. We have sought and taken council from the Portuguese Golf Federation to ensure that going forward we are consistent with other clubs of a similar structure.

Details will be provided to you for your consideration well in advance of the AGM. These documents will reference our intention to form a number of sub-committees, reflecting our desire to improve communication and wider membership involvement in the management of our club activities.

Accordingly, we will be seeking candidates and would appreciate hearing from any interested member, once you've had the opportunity to consider the documents.

Please note that throughout this process we are required to acknowledge that we are a members section operating within a propriety owned golf club, and with the inherent restrictions that involves.

## Director of Golf – Monthly Report

Dear Members,

It is with considerable disappointment that I am writing to inform you of Mr. Walter Dickson's recent decision to step down from his role as Club President.

Walter was the first official Captain of the Club in 1999, which created the stepping stone to the Club we have today. He became President of Pinheiros Altos Golf Club in 2000 until 2003 and then stood for a second term as President of the Club in 2007 until now.

For a decade and more his steady hand and guidance have been invaluable.

Walter has been a great support for the Members - in a not always easy environment of propriety owned Golf Club - and has always been a master at keeping the balance between the Members Club and the Company. The Membership owe a lot to Walter's input within the Pinheiros Altos Club and his experience and knowledge will be missed on the Committee.

We send our best wishes and appreciation to Walter for his considerable contribution to our club.

Looking ahead... I have the pleasure to announce that the immediate past Captain, Mr. David Markey, has agreed to stand for the Presidency of Pinheiros Altos Golf Club for a mandate of 3 years from the time of this publication until the 2017 AGM.

David joined Pinheiros Altos in 2004 and has been a great supporter of the Pinheiros Altos Golf Club ever since.

He became Vice-captain to John Linley in 2011 and the Club Captain at the AGM of 2012.

I have no doubt that David will be exceptional in the position of President and will maintain the right balance between the Club and the Company.

I am also delighted to announce that Stewart Harper has accepted your committee's invitation to become David Pirret's Vice-Captain at the 2014 AGM. Stewart was a little hesitant with his acceptance as the appointment coincides with his wife Cathy also being the incoming Lady Vice Captain for 2014.

This introduces the prospect of a notable first for Pinheiros in 2015, as husband and wife become respective Club & Lady Captains.

Stewart and Cathy have been members of Pinheiros since 1998 and have previously been Respective Captain and Lady Captain of the Wilmslow Golf Club in Cheshire where Stewart was also President in 2001.

I am sure they will both be a credit to our Golf Committee and wish them every success with their new roles and participation in the continuing development of our Club

January 2014 started with a fantastic New Year's Day scramble, and as usual the sun was shining on the 135 players who took part on the day. The good weather kept up until the Algarvian Invitational Golf Championship, which saw the first day of the tournament having to be suspended due to adverse weather.

On the 2nd day of the tournament all the competitors had to go back to the point they stopped when play was suspended, finish their 1st round... and then continue to play straight into their 2nd round. For some this meant playing 34 holes, from 9am until 6pm - non-stop, a real marathon! By the 3rd and final day we still had 5 groups to finish their second rounds before we could kick off the last round at 10am. Luckily, the bad weather held off long enough for all 69 players to finish their complete roster of 54 holes. It took some organization to manage, but I have to congratulate all my staff and especially the green staff for making this tournament possible.

We could not have had a better reward than having the luxury 3 balls playing the last round of the tournament, Miguel Angel Martin (he shot the course record 63 on his first round and was 4th in the Seniors European order of merit 2013), Steen Tinning (2nd on the Senior European order of merit 2013) and Paul Wesselingh (Winner of the 2013 Senior European order of merit). The winner in the end at Pinheiros Altos was Miguel Angel Martin who finished 10 under par for the 3 rounds winning €5,000. The main reason for having such a quality field was due to the large amount of prize money on offer. There was a total of €19,970, mainly thanks to Pinheiros Altos Member Mr. John Waters, who has been the prime sponsor for the first 2 Algarvian Invitationals. Mr. John Waters has already confirmed that he will continue to (very generously in our opinion) sponsor next year's event and hopefully a second event which will be announced soon. A big Thank you to John for his continued support of this event.

## PRO TIP by Kenny Fairbairn

### Weight transfer in the downswing

I like to think of the downswing as a chain reaction. The first link in the chain is the left side. It moves into and through the ball, pulling the hands down, also into and through. The hands in turn pull the clubhead down, into and through. The left side must go through the shot. It shouldn't stop at the ball and wait for the hands to catch up. The hands will do that automatically.
